ENVISIONING A TRULY INCLUSIVE JEWISH COMMUNITY

Kohenet Dr. Harriette E. Wimms: Jews of Color Engagement within the Associated and the founder and director of the Jews of Color Mishpacha Project along with Tracy Guy-Decker, Senior Partner with Joyous Justice, LLC and co-creator and co-host with April Baskin of the podcast "Jews Talk Racial Justice with April and Tracie" provided our members with a special and in-depth program about just how inclusive are we. Both speakers referenced our Torah as well as spiritual leaders and experts in the field of society and inclusion within a society. They shared slides with the audience. One that stood out was this: "Equal rights for others does not mean fewer rights for you. It's not a pie!" Well said! Opening out hearts and minds may be a process that requires a daily refresh. Following the formal part of the presentation, an engaging discussion with all our participants about equality, equity, diversity and belonging ensued. We were fortunate to have such talented women.

November Meeting Report: by CeCe Rund



As part of the Women's Federation mission to be a resource and a voice for the organizations under our umbrella, we strive to keep our members abreast of important developments that affect us, our families, and our communities. To that end, on September 17th, we were honored to feature as our keynote speaker Barry Rascovar, professor, author, commentator, consultant, and an influential voice on Maryland politics for over four decades.

The topic of Mr. Rascovar's post-election presentation was "America at a Crossroads," and he did not disappoint! In his astute and frank assessment, Mr. Rascovar noted that while not much has changed as a result of the election, there is still a lot of uncertainty. Despite high inflation, crime, the repeal of Roe v. Wade, and a 44% approval rate of President Biden's performance,

Barry Rascovar crime, the repeal of the media were wrong about a "red wave."

In Mr. Rascovar's analysis, the deciding factors for Democratic wins were abortion rights, high student loans, and concerns about threats to democracy. Additionally, Democrats were able to win over independent and Hispanic voters. Nevertheless, Mr. Rascovar predicted that Donald Trump will be the nominee for president in 2024, either for the Republican Party or as an independent candidate. As for what the election brought us in DC is a return of control in the Senate by Democrats and forthcoming "gridlock," Mr. Rascovar said.

Mr. Rascovar concluded his presentation by observing that "ranked choice voting" in elections, as is practiced in Alaska for example, is a good sign for preserving democracy. We would like to give a big thank you to our keynote speaker, Barry Rascovar, and to our President Cece Rund for sponsoring him.


