IN MEMORY OF CAROL J. CAPLAN



A long time, active member of our Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Maryland, Carol Joseph Caplan passed away on July 25, 2023 at the age of 95. Carol grew up in the Forest Park area of Baltimore and graduated from Forest Park High in 1945. She then attended and earned a Bachelor's Degree from Mount St. Agnes College and then embarked on a career as a social worker for the State of Maryland. However, her true passion was as a volunteer at Baltimore Hebrew Congregation and with various Jewish organizations. For many years, she served as an adult advisor to the Junior and Senior Youth groups (as they were known at the time). Carol also volunteered with many different parts of Baltimore Hebrew Congregation including Sisterhood (served as President), the BHC Cares Committee, the Interfaith Institute and served on the Board and Nominating Committees of Baltimore Hebrew. In 2005, Baltimore Hebrew Congregation honored Carol by naming their Volunteer of the Year award after her. Carol was a past President of our Federation and also served on the regional and national boards of Women of Reform Judaism.

Carol's decades of service to her community were underpinned by the immense value she placed on her family, her congregation and her faith. She was a firm believer in L'dor v'dor as she tried to pass on values, traditions, culture and history to the next generation. She truly made the world a better place through her commitment to performing acts of tikkun olam and her belief in the power of faith to overcome challenges and bring people together. She is deeply missed.

107th Annual Convention Report

On May 18, 2023, we held our 107th Annual Convention at Baltimore Hebrew Congregation. Our theme was, **“Women Who Lead, Influence and Inspire”**.

Over 280 ladies from our Jewish community attended this inspiring and informative day. Registration included a canvas bag, pen, program book and a free copy of Lilith magazine. The morning session started with a special greeting from Attorney General Brown and Delegate Rosenberg. They recognized our program and our resolutions as being important to Maryland and congratulated our E.B. Hirsh recipient and our honorees. We continued with our morning business meeting that included inducting our First Vice President, Shula Finkelstein and our Recording Secretary, Eve Kresin Steinberg. We also voted on our three 2023 Resolutions; Equity for Women, Mental Health Today and Antisemitism: Revisited. These most important resolutions were all passed unanimously. Our organizations are invited to utilize these resolutions as needed. The resolutions are in the program book and can also be found on our website; jewishwomensfed.org. CeCe Rund, President, provided a report that updated all on our activities and future endeavors within the Federation and our community.

The highlight of the morning session was the giving of the E.B. Hirsh Lifetime Achievement Award to Betsy Narrow, an inspirational community leader. Following Betsy’s acceptance speech, attendees were ushered into the lunch room where Yaffa provided a delicious chicken lunch. Over 13 of our Maryland legislators took time to attend our lunch, address the attendees and to provide citations for the Federation! Following lunch, our keynote speaker, Susan Weidman Schneider, founder and editor of Lilith magazine, presented her program about women learning to turn off their mute button. This was most introspective and thought provoking. Ms. Schneider also sold and signed her book, Frankly Feminist, at the conclusion of the convention.

Rochelle Bohrer concluded the convention with our highlight: Presenting the honorees from each constituent organization with the award, **“A Woman Who Leads the Way”**. Everyone watched a video production (produced by Eve Vogelstein and Marcia Bornfriend) showing each recipient receiving her rose and certificate and providing a short speech. We are always so proud of these wonderful women and thank them for their leadership and their inspiration. This convention was certainly an inspirational day. On July 18, 2023, The Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Maryland and The Associated partnered to sponsor a program featuring, Laura Black, author of Climbing Down the Ladder: Finding A New Kind of Happiness. Nina Rosenswog from the Federation and Melinda Michel from The Associated worked with a combined team from both organizations to bring this exciting program together.

Baltimore Hebrew Congregation was the venue and over eighty ladies attended. The day began with pastries, fresh sliced fruits and coffee and women were able to schmooze prior to the actual program. Laura Black opened the program by reading excerpts from her book and then delved into the content. The room was then divided into groups and given poignant questions to ponder and discuss. These questions came from information in the book and were issues that women deal with throughout their careers as a professional, a mother, wife or a volunteer. Each table summarized their discussions for the entire room. Laura took all of this information and brought it to a conclusion by explaining how women, who were so very busy, and defined by their working careers or their volunteer life or their status in their younger years and who now face retirement or have already retired may find themselves climbing down that successful, incredibly busy life. What now? Where and how do women find satisfaction and happiness in life? Well, I suppose one will have to read her book to discover that answer.

Ms. Black sold and signed her books at this program. All proceeds from the day, including book sales were donated to The Associated to support their mental health programs.
