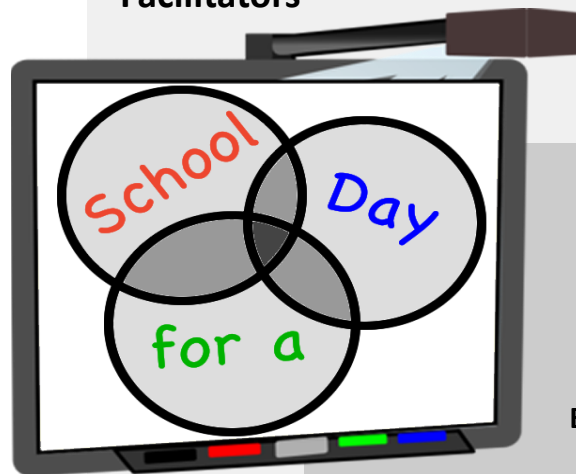

Social Action Project—Samaritan Women

The Samaritan Women operates transitional and restorative shelter programs for women recovering from domestic human trafficking. The Samaritan Women also engage in combatting domestic human trafficking through awareness, prevention, service and advocacy.
