Federation Legislative Update—2023

It was just a few years ago that we were celebrating the 19th amendment that passed Congress on June 4, 1919 and was ratified August 18, 1920. Here we are in April of

2023 and I can't stop thinking about how different our lives as women would be without the right to vote. Forty years ago the Maryland General Assembly Women's Caucus created an official position to prioritize through legislation: The Declaration Of Rights which is the right to reproductive Freedom. The Right to

Reproductive liberty has moved through both branches of our legislature with a promise from Governor Moore to sign it.

I, as a citizen of this state, am proud of the men and women representing us in Annapolis. The next move

from House Speaker, Adrienne Jones, is to ensure abortion rights become part of the Maryland State Constitution. This would guarantee abortion rights in Maryland in the future.



Mid Winter Conference Report—by Shulamit Finkelstein

On January 26, 2023, we were blown away by three women CEOs of multi-million dollar Israeli high tech companies: Carly Furman, CEO of Nayax LLC, a leading provider of cashless payment solutions in the North American market and the Western Hemisphere; Jennifer Roby, Vice President of Finance and CFO of Elta North America, a company working to solve complex and advanced defense and homeland security challenges for the U.S. government, including the manufacture of radar for the Iron Dome and Vered Caplan, CEO of Orgenesis, a global biotech company working on cell and gene therapies collaboratively with Johns Hopkins Medicine. This talk was moderated by Nancy Boguslaw, Deputy Director of the Maryland/Israel Development Center (MIDC). These women also happen to work in our own back yard of Baltimore! The CEOs told us how they came to be interested in high tech and how they rose to become leaders in what are typically male-dominated fields. We learned about their unique leadership styles, and how, as mothers and grandmothers, we can support our daughters and granddaughters in their career choices. All presentations were most impressive and inspiring.

Representative-President Forum Getting to Know You: Getting to Know US

Twenty-four representatives and/or presidents of our constituent organizations attended our first *Representative-Presidents Forum* held at Har Sinai-Oheb Shalom Congregation on February 23, 2023. The title of this program was "Getting to Know YOU: Getting to Know Us" as the Federation wanted to develop a closer relationship with our membership. As an umbrella organization, The Federation of Jewish Women's Organizations of Maryland crosses all branches of Judaism with its 25 organizational membership. Our goal is to unite Jewish women and to educate, advocate and keep our Jewish women informed and strong. We shared information about the Federation: who we are, what we do and our future plans. One new initiative is appointing one of our vice presidents, Julie Bernstein, as The Representative Liaison for our organizations. We can look forward to stronger communication through our membership organization representatives and a conduit where our organizational representatives can share concerns, needs and ideas.

The feedback about this program from the attendees was very positive. The attendees felt that the information was needed, interesting and helpful. Suggestions for future programs included a high response for programs regarding antisemitism and how to talk to your children and grandchildren about facing antisemitism in high school and college campuses. Based upon this feedback, we will now use our web site, jewishwomensfed.org, as a resource site. We will be posting resources for all regarding issues on antisemitism, how to report an incident, links to articles about dealing with antisemitism and talking with your children/grandchildren about this most sensitive and real topic. We also completed a new resolution on antisemitism which will be revealed at our annual convention at Baltimore Hebrew Congregation on May 18, 2023.

Another important suggested topic was engaging younger members to your organization, succession planning and how to keep your organization afloat. Based upon this request, we look forward to having Annette Saxon addressing these issues at our President's Reception on June 29th. The exchange of information during this breakfast forum was most informative and we look forward to sponsoring more such programs in the future.
