

These revised bylaws will be voted upon by YOU at our 108th convention. This summer, the committee will review all standing and ad hoc committee responsibilities and revise as needed to keep up with our changing times.

Resolutions are researched for accurate background information, carefully reviewed and finally released following scrutinization. These statements are part of what we Jewish women stand for and can be used by YOU as you are navigating through such issues. Last year, Attorney General Brown referred to one of our resolutions during his welcoming speech. Other legislators read them with interest as well

MEET OUR ORGANIZATIONS

Kappa Guild, Inc. The mission of Kappa Guild is "helping children in need" and is a Baltimore based organization. This tireless group of dedicated women have raised approximately over \$10,000 annually for the purchase of needed equipment for the pediatric and NICU units of hospitals, camps for children with special needs or illnesses such as Horizon Day Camp for children with cancer, Rose of Sharon Equestrian School for children with autism and MS, Kennedy Krieger Institute and Center for Hope to support children who are abused or going through trauma. Kappa Guild was named after a high school sorority Kappa Sigma Tau and started as a social group. They started focusing on nonprofit work after Sally Rifkin, the first president, visited her son in the hospital and noticed that he had no toys to play with while there. Through fund raising events such as fashion shows, Game Days, holiday gift wrapping, sale of mah jongg cards and mitzvah cards, just to name a few, they are able to raise the funds to purchase such items as baby scales, transilluminators, wheel chairs, stethoscopes and camp equipment among other needed items.

MID-WINTER CONFERENCE REVIEW

Our January meeting was held via Zoom. **Rekha Gibbons**, the "generational guru" and advisor to Fortune 500 companies, spoke about "Cracking the Code: Demystifying the Younger Generations." We learned that throughout history, each generation has distinguished itself from the previous generation. While this has usually led to conflict and tension, it has also been good for energizing growth, innovation and progress. Ms. Gibbons emphasized that understanding how each generation is wired promotes harmony and good communication.

Ms. Gibbons identified six current distinct generational age groups, each with its own unique values, styles and stereotypes. She named the six generational groups as follows: the Silent Generation, the Boomers, Gen X, the Millennials, Gen Z and Alpha. Each group has been shaped by the technology of its day in terms of actual brain changes and different modes of communication. We were encouraged be open minded, ask questions and be fearless in communicating with each group.

MARCH MEETING WITH BARBARA WEINSTEIN



Our March breakfast was something of a milestone. The Women's Federation held its first meeting in Howard County, partnering with the Sisterhood of Temple Isaiah Congregation. Janis Wasser, Sisterhood President, was most efficacious in arranging a warm welcome for our guests and Federation members from both Baltimore and Howard Counties. Temple Isaiah's Rabbi, Craig H. Axler, gave the opening blessing.

We were honored to have Barbara Weinstein, Associate Director of the Commission on Social Action of Reform Judaism as our speaker. Her timely and important topic was "Raising Our Voices as Jewish Women." Ms. Weinstein began by noting the importance of women regaining agency over their bodies in light of the overturning of Roe v. Wade. A further issue of importance is the growth of antisemitism. Ms. Weinstein informed us that protections and civil rights of LGBT persons are in jeopardy in 23 states. Further issues of importance include unequal pay for women, family leave and efforts to protect the vote. Ms. Weinstein emphasized that all of these issues are important to Jewish women. She encouraged us to educate ourselves on the issues and to keep in touch with our elected officials through multiple means of communication, to "embrace a vibrant and engaged Jewish life, to be generous and gentle with each other and to be like Esther to support each other."

Following her presentation, she generously remained to answer the many questions that the attendees had regarding advocacy for these most important challenges that we are facing.
