Lola Hahn, our guest speaker and daughter of Holocaust survivors, was warmly received by our attendees. The topic of her presentation was "Stories of Survival." Lola's

riveting story of how her mother and two aunts survived the Holocaust moved our attendees deeply.

Our social action project for this meeting was in partnership with Kappa Guild. Attendees were asked to bring art and school supplies, toys and games for the children at Mount Washington Children's Hospital. Rochelle Bohrer, Federation's Corresponding Secretary, reported that six bags and one large box of donated items were delivered to the hospital. She reported that the hospital's staff "was surprised, excited and appreciative to receive the contribution from Kappa and Federation." Rochelle added that "it was a wonderful feeling to do the mitzvah of fulfilling the Guild's mission of helping children in need."
