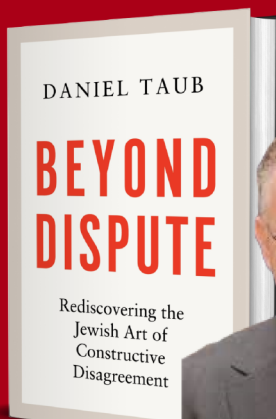

Federation Legislative Update—2025

A look forward. The outlook for the coming months and for 2026 are covered with fog and we are not fortunetellers.

We need to continue to be extra vigilant in responding to antisemitism in K-12 schools and college campuses.

Five things that stand out as we go to press: Peace in our time? What will be the outcome of the peace initiatives for the Israeli-Hamas continuing war? What will be the outcome of the Ukrainian-Russian war? Can the United States stay out of either war if the negotiations continue to fail?

There is growing concern over recent polls among the American population showing that support for Israel is slowly decreasing. The U.S. Congress and Senate also show small shifts in positions as the media photos of starving children play on the heartstrings of the American public.



And here in Maryland we are watching to see the effect of last session's attempts to balance the budget by raising fees not taxes. Will other actions to "cut taxes for the middle class" actually make a difference? How will the federal budget cuts affect Maryland's many programs to sustain the poorest of us and assist the middle class? The coming legislature will again face budget, budget, budget.

We will continue to monitor these and many other areas as we go forward.
